We warmly invite you to our expert dialogue **Change, please! Fair procurement of e-vehicles**. The dialogue will take place online on **Thursday, 16 November 2023 from 9:30 am to 1:30 pm CET**. Participation is free of charge.

The public sector has an important role to play in renewing and expanding its own vehicle fleet. It can contribute significantly to the expansion of public transport and the transformation to a low-emission vehicle fleet by increasing investments and creating socially and ecologically responsible procurement systems. National administrations, federal states and municipalities – together with the automotive industry – can fulfil their responsibility for achieving the Paris climate targets by actively organising a sustainable transport transformation.

The extraction of the natural resources needed for e-mobility is accompanied in many places by serious social and environmental risks and grievances. Strengthening human rights and environmental due diligence along the entire supply chain is therefore particularly important. The public sector has an exemplary function to play in shaping the transport transformation in a socially and ecologically responsible way.

At the expert dialogue **Change, please! Fair procurement of e-vehicles**, we will discuss the following questions:

- What does a socio-ecological transport transformation look like?
- How can the public sector work towards greater compliance with human and labour rights in the supply chains of the automotive industry?
- Which projects already exist that take socio-ecological criteria into account in public tenders?

In order to discuss these and other exciting questions, we have invited representatives from public transport companies, administrations, businesses and NGOs.


